SPECIFICATIONS FOR REPAIR WORK ON THE LECOMPTON BRIDGE.

GENERAL:-

The work required will consist of adjusting the counters and the laterals, wherever any adjustment is needed and of thoroughly cleaning and painting all metal work of the bridge, both superstructure and piers. The railing shall also be painted.

LOCATION OF WORK:-

The bridge to be painted and adjusted is located at the town of Lecompton and is about 900 feet in length. It connects Douglas and Jefferson Counties and is jointly owned by the two counties.

CLEANING:-

The metal shall be cleaned and all loose scale or rust shall be removed by scraping and brushing with steel brushes, or by any other effective method which is not injurious to the bridge.

PAINTING:-

The two spans which were re-erected after being taken out by the ice gorge are to have one coat of paint. The other spans and piers are to have two coats of paint. The second coat of paint shall not be put on within six days after the first coat is in place. Care shall be taken to have all portions of the work completely covered with paint and to brush the paint thoroughly and evenly.

MATERIAL:-

The Counties will furnish the necessary paint and the contractor shall furnish the labor and scaffolds or ladders and tools necessary to put the paint in place, and make the adjustments and do the cleaning.

INSPECTION:-

The work shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Boards of County Commissioners of the two counties or their authorized representatives and upon completion will be subjected to a final inspection.

It is also agreed, That no payments shall be made by the party of the second part on account of labor performed or materials furnished under this contract, to any person or persons without an express order in writing from the principals of the party of the first part.
