The lowest bidder, R. E. French was awarded the contract to furnish material as specified by the Co. Engineer, F. B. Lawrence, all measurements guaranteed by the county, material to be paid for upon acceptance by the commissioners and to be delivered within 90 days from date of contract (being July 13, 1914), said material to have fish plates riveted on one end of the joists and to be bored ready for placing in position for the sum of \$ 437.00.

C. H. King was awarded the contract to erect the material for the above bridge for the sum of \$ 55.00 including the receiving and transportation of said material from Lawrence Depot, work to be completed within 30 days from the arrival of the material in Lawrence.
