A surety bond for \$300.00 given by the Jim Bonding and Surety Co. of Omaha, Neb. for the performance of the above contract was approved by this Board.

Board contracted with The World Co. represented by W. E. Simons, to print the ballots for the General Election held November 3, 1914, at the legal rate.

Board convened in executive session and by unanimous vote appointed Eric Owen to succeed A. L. Selig as Commissioner of the Poor, his term of office to begin Oct. 1, 1914 and to expire April 1, 1916 or upon the qualification of his successor. The last mentioned appointment was made upon the consideration of a communication from A. L. Selig urging the Board to select his successor and relieve him from further duty.

Board adjourned to September 19, 1914.

Board met in regular adjourned session with J. L. Hoover, Chairman and Geo. H. Brune present. Commissioners Hoover and Brune accompanied by A. L. Selig, Comm. of the Poor, visited the County Home and reported everything in 1st class condition.

Board remitted the fine of Robert Ingrams upon condition that he enlist in the regular army within three days from September 21, 1914 and authorized the Asst. Clerk to instruct the Sheriff to discharge him from custody.

Board set the date for viewing the road petitioned for by Geo. J. Broers and 21 others in Indara Township between Douglas and Johnson Counties, at October 15th 1914.
