Take notice that, according to the provisions of Senate Bill No. 36 on the Laws of 1913, which Bill became effective Mar. 5, 1913, unless the taxpayer appears at the meeting of the County Board of Equalization in May at the time or times before mentioned, there will thereafter be no opportunity to get the valuation of his property reduced.
