Now on this 4th day of April, 1916, the petition for the organization & incorporation of a drainage district to be known as the Clinton, Kanawaka & Wakarusa Drainage District of Douglas County, Kansas, came on for hearing, the same having been adjourned from the 25th day of March, 1916, and it appearing to the Board of County Commissioners that notice has been given of the time of the hearing as required by law, & the said Board having heard the evidence of all persons in favor or opposed to granting the prayer of said petition, and being fully advised in the premises, and it further appearing that said petition contains the proper number of signers, possessing the qualifications prescribed by law, and that the allegations of said petition are true,

It is therefore ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the territory described in said petition constitute a public corporation, and the inhabitants within such bonds be incorporated in a drainage district under the name of The Clinton, Kanawaka & Wakarusa Drainage District of Douglas County,
