#### Road Notice

State of Kansas, Douglas County, Office of County Clerk, Lawrence, Kansas, April 16, 1916.

Notice is hereby given that on the 29th day of January, 1916, a petition signed by D. W. Dews and seventeen others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County and State aforesaid praying for the construction of a certain road, described as follows:

Beginning at the quarter section corner between sections twenty-six (26) and thirty-five (35) in township twelve (12) S of range fifteen (15) east of 6th P. M., thence south on the quarter section line one-half mile to center of section thirty-five (35).

Whereupon, said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following named persons, viz., H. B. Green, G. H. Bruno and J. J. Hayes, as viewers, with instructions to meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor, at the place of beginning of said road in Kawaka township, on Friday, the 12th day of May, A. D., 1916, and proceed to view said road and render to all parties a hearing.
