The Board of County Commissioners met in special session to canvass the votes cast in a special election held in Franklin, Kansas on June 1st 1916 for the purpose of voting on a proposition to establish a rural high school. Commissioners W.R. Green and J.L. Hoenen and Herman Broker, County Clerk being present the votes were canvassed and it was found that there were:

169 votes cast for a Rural High School (Yes)

68 .. " against " .. (No)

164 .. " to issue bonds (Yes)

66 .. " against bond issue (No)
