

Monday June 12, 1916

The Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

Claims against the county were allowed as per allowance record.

Board ordered the county clerk to issue a refunding warrant to Fred W. Ott to the amount of \$16.00 for land which was lost by flood and which he had paid taxes on.

To The Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas.

We, the undersigned tax-payers of Douglas County, hereby protest against having the road between Eudora and Lawrence graded with "power" graders, thereby making them almost impassable, as was the case when they were graded a year ago.

This petition was signed by 134 signers.

The Board ordered the grader removed from said road.

In the matter of the petition of Robt. M. Jones & 15 others, filed June 8, 1916, for the vacation of a road described as follows: Beginning at N.E. cor. of section 34, T. 13 S. R. 19 E.

Thence South Westerly in the NE⁴ of NE⁴ of said sec. 34. Thence South Easterly in the SE⁴ of NE⁴ of said sec. 34. Being Road No. 515 Recorded at page #163 of Road Record No. 3.

The Board designated July 21, as the date for viewing.

Road Notice.

Notice is hereby given that on June 8, 1916, a petition signed by Robert M. Jones and fifteen others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, praying for the vacation of a certain road in said county, described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of section 34, township thirteen (13) range nineteen (19) east, thence southwesterly in the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said section 34, thence southeasterly in the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said section 34, being road No. 515 recorded at page 163 of Road Record No. 3.

The said Board of County Commissioners will meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on July 21, 1916, and proceed to view said road.
