

Wednesday September 13, 1916

Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present. Claims against the county were allowed as per allowance record.

The Board approved the petition of the City of Lawrence filed June 14, 1916 in regard to taking Engle property into the city.

Three ballots were taken, Hoover voting at first and second blank and at third for the petition; Green voting for it all three times and Bruno voting against it. No one then moved that the vote be called unanimous for the petition. The Board expressed their approval. (See pages 108-112.)

Saturday September 16, 1916

Board met in regular adjourned session with all members present.

County Attorney requested bids for coal. At 3 P.M. only one bid being presented. Orley M. Smith was awarded the contract.

Contract between

Douglas County and
Citizens Light Heat & Power Co.

This contract entered into this 23 day of September 1916, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas consisting of W.R. Green, Gus N. Bruno and J.L. Hoover, parties of the first part and the Citizens Light Heat and Power Company, a corporation of the State of Delaware, party of the second part witnesseth,

That whereas the parties of the first part representing the County of Douglas in the state of Kansas, are engaged in building a re-enforced concrete bridge across the Kansas river at the City of Lawrence;

And whereas there is a space provided on said bridge for the carrying of water mains, gas mains, telephone and telegraph cables and conduits;
