Douglas County and

Citizen's Light, Heat & Power Co.

This contract entered into this 23 day of September 1916, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, consisting of W. R. Green, Gus W. Brum and J. L. Hoover, parties of the first part and the Citizen's Light, Heat & Power Company, a corporation of the State of Delaware, party of the second part witnesseth,

That whereas the parties of the first part representing the County of Douglas in the State of Kansas, are engaged in building a re-inforced concrete bridge across the Kansas river at the City of Lawrence;

And whereas there is a space provided on said bridge for the carrying of water mains, gas mains, telephone and telegraph cables and conduits.
