

Monday, January 8, 1917.

The Board of County Commissioners was called to order by the chairman, W. R. Green. Members present: W. R. Green, J. L. Hoover and A. Andrews.

The board recognized for 1917 by the election of J. L. Hoover as Chairman. H. H. Gillum was designated by the board as janitor for the ensuing year.

The Resignations of J. E. Dolise as treasurer of Eudora township, and G. E. Miller as clerk of Eudora township were read, and upon motion accepted.

Upon unanimous consent the board announced the appointments of Mr. G. E. Miller as treasurer of Eudora township and of Mr. J. E. Dolise as clerk of Eudora township.

With a view of arranging a date for a joint meeting of the boards of Commissioners from Douglas and Leavenworth Counties the clerk was instructed to get in touch with the clerk of Leavenworth County and endeavor, if possible, to ascertain the wishes of the board from that County.

Claims were allowed against the County (See allowance Book). The board recommended the assessment of Mrs. Geo. Hausman as of school district No. 28 Eudora township. He cancelled a subsequent assessment of same amount he made as from Palmyra township, school district #57.

The board drove to Leavenworth County today & met with the Leavenworth County board for a conference in regard to the Eudora bridge.

Wednesday, January 10 - 1917.

The board of County Commissioners met with all members present. Chairman J. L. Hoover called the session to order.

The bid of the Lawrence Journal-World to be designated as the official county paper, with 5 cents per count line for publishing reports of bids allowed, and for all other printing at regular legal rates, was reported by Commissioner Andrews, accepted by the board.

The applications of Holland Wheeler and Lloyd Duffie for appointment as County Engineer were read and a vote being ordered resulted in two (2) votes for Duffie and one (1) vote for Wheeler. Upon motion the appointment of Duffie as County Engineer was made unanimous.

The applications of Dr. John C. Rudolph and Dr. E. Smith for appointment as County Health Officer were read, and a vote being ordered resulted in two (2) votes for Rudolph and one (1) vote for Smith.
