

Monday - March 5 - 1917 -

The board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session, with Commissioners Green and Andrew present, and Commissioner at Chairman J. L. Horner absent, owing to sickness.

Tuesday, March 6 - 1917 -

Wednesday - March 7 - 1917 -

The board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session, with all members present and Chairman J. L. Horner in the chair.

Upon motion of Commissioner A. Andrew, seconded by Commissioner Green, the action of the board of County Commissioners, at their meeting held Wednesday, February 14, 1917, in cancelling the Robinson estate tax levied in Court Township, was reconsidered. The action was unanimously concurred in.

Commissioner Andrew thereupon moved that the action of the Commissioners in cancelling the Robinson estate tax be revoked and that that portion of the minutes of the meeting of February 14, 1917, be stricken from the records. Motion seconded by Commissioner Green and adopted by unanimous vote.

The board canvassed the election returns from the Maple Grove Drainage District, held Tuesday, March 6, 1917. The poll books and tally sheet showed a total of nine (9) votes cast, and that -

Vernon M. King - 1 - Director.

T. F. Pine - 1 - Director.

The above three persons accordingly were declared elected and certificate of election delivered to them by the clerk.
