

Monday, May 7, 1917.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session, all members present, and Commissioner J. L. Hoover presiding.

Claims against the County were allowed, as per Allowance Record. The depositary bond of the Farmers State Bank at Vinland, Kansas, in amount \$5,000, was approved.

Tuesday, May 8, 1917.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned session, all members being present and Commissioner J. L. Hoover presiding.

An agreement between the County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas and the Kansas Telephone Co. for permission by the latter to strung their telephones wires through conduct over the Kansas River bridges, upon payment annually not later than May 12 of each year, of a rental of \$100.00, was entered into by both parties to the agreement, and signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the General Manager of the Kansas Telephone Co., and attested by the County Clerk.

Claims against the County were allowed, for which see Allowance Record.

The monthly reports of the County Physician, Dr. E. D. Phillips, of the Poor Commissioners, John Meschlin, and of the Superintendent of the County Home, C. G. Sigler, were presented, read and approved.

The claim of the Logan Grove Lumber Co. for 40% for material furnished, was rejected.
