The board resumed this session as a board of equalization for residents of the city of Lawrence, and listened to complaints. Action on all complaints was deferred.

Upon petition of Mr. James Owens, his personal property assessment was reduced from \$10,960 to \$9,960. This reduction was made necessary by a misunderstanding between Mr. Owens and the Deputy Assessor who returned the erroneous assessment return.

Upon application of Mr. John N. Johnson, and with the authority of the State Tax Commission, the real estate assessment for the current year on the S 1/2 of lot 171 Lawrence street, and lots 172, also Lawrence street, was reduced \$1875 - from a total of \$7,775 to \$6,400.

Upon motion of Commissioner Andrews, seconded by Commissioner Green, the clerk was directed to notify the County Treasurer, to abate the taxes, amounting to \$1,267.57 appearing on the tax records in the name of the Union Pacific Railroad Company as a special charge for paving on Locust street, north Lawrence, the same having been entered upon the records in error after such special tax had been paid to the city treasurer of Lawrence by the Union Pacific Railroad Company.

The board continued its session today as an Equalization board to hear complaints from residents of the city of Lawrence.

On complaint of Kate C. Clark, and upon authority issued by the state tax commission, the board granted a reduction of \$25.00 on the value of improvements on lot 99 Pennsylvania street, and also a reduction of \$400.00 on the value of improvements on lot 101 Pennsylvania street. The reduction was recommended by the Deputy Assessor and confirmed by County Assessor.

Upon petition of Mrs. H. Woods, the board granted a reduction in the assessed valuation of improvements on lot 99 New Hampshire street.
