

Tuesday, July 10 - 1917 -

The board met in adjourned regular session, all members being present, + Chairman J. L. Hoover presiding.

The board authorized the acceptance of an offer of \$75.00 in compromise of the taxes on certain land in Leocompton township, Douglas County, described on the tax rolls as follows: "Beginning at a point 23 rods 7 feet east from the southeast corner of the southeast quarter of section 34, township 11, Range 18; thence east twelve rods four feet, thence north eight rods nine feet, thence west twelve rods four feet, thence south eight rods nine feet to the place of beginning."

The offer of compromise was made by Mr. J. W. Kreider of Leocompton, and the clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Kreider of his offer of compromise.

Claims against the county were allowed, as per Allowance Record.

The board adjourned to reconvene in adjourned regular session on Saturday, July 14, 1917.

The grand jury report of D. C. Shoups, County Treasurer, showing a total of \$25.15 in fees + tax warrant collection, was approved.

Saturday, July 14 - 1917 -

The board met in adjourned regular session, with all members present + Chairman J. L. Hoover presiding.

A check for \$20.70, from the Citizens Light, Heat + Power Co.; as rent for past six months of 1917 for privilege of using Leocompton bridge for carrying gas mains, was received and ordered covered into the special bridge fund of the county.

The clerk was authorized to advertise for bids for coal for the season of 1917-18 for the Court House + jail, for the County Home + for purposes - the coal at Court House + jail to be delivered in lump at said buildings; the coal at County Home to be delivered in car lots at India station, + the coal for purposes to be delivered in quantity of 500 pounds. The kind of coal to be deep shaft Cherokee lump. Bids are to be opened at 12 o'clock noon on Saturday, Aug. 11 - 1917 - + the right is reserved to reject any or all bids.
