The said county is truly held and firmly bound, and its faith and credit are hereby pledged for the prompt payment of this bond with the interest thereon at maturity.

This bond is one of a series of fifty bonds of like date, tenor and effect, except as to date of maturity, numbered from one to fifty, both inclusive, aggregating \$25,000.00, issued by said county for the purpose of funding certain floating indebtedness, under the authority of an act of the Legislature of the State of Kansas, entitled, "An Act authorizing the Board of County Commissioners to issue bonds for the purpose of funding the floating indebtedness against said County existing at the time of the passage of this act, or to levy a special tax for said purpose, or to pay such indebtedness out of the general revenues found under certain conditions," approved February 9, 1917, and under authority of resolution duly passed by said board of County Commissioners.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of bonds have been properly done, have happened, and have been performed in accordance and due form as required by law; that the floating indebtedness represented and funded by this series of bonds is a valid, binding and subsisting obligation of said County outstanding prior to the passage of the act of the Legislature herinbefore recited; and that the total indebtedness of Douglas County, State of Kansas, including this series of bonds, does not exceed any statutory or constitutional limitation.
