The following petition for Rural High School and Bond election was presented to the board:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas:

We, the undersigned, legal electors residing in a territory containing not less than sixteen square miles and comprising that part of Eudora township described below, all within Douglas County, Kansas, being desirous of establishing a Rural High School district in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 311 of the Session Laws of Kansas of 1915, as amended by House Bill No. 586 of the Session Laws of 1917, do hereby petition your honorable body to call a special election for the purpose of voting on the proposition of establishing and locating a Rural High School, and to vote bonds for the construction of a high school building.

The boundaries of said proposed Rural High school district in which we, your petitioners, reside, are as follows: Beginning at a point on the south bank of the Kaw river due north of the N.W. corner of Section 36, Township 12, Range 20, thence south to the southeast corner of Section 13, Township 13, Range 20, thence east one mile, thence south one mile, thence east one mile, thence south one mile, thence east three miles to the County line, thence north to the south bank of the Kaw river, thence up said river to the point of beginning.
