

annual assessments to be levied upon the lands above described constituting said Benefit Road District, and from all other funds provided by law for such purposes.

We further request your honorable body to find and declare said road improvements to be a public utility by order of your board, and to make an order that said improvements be made and paid for and that all necessary action therefor be taken as prescribed in Chapters 265, 264 and 80 of the Revision Laws of 1917.

Here follows a list of 47 names, with a description of the land, the number of acres owned or controlled by each person.

Commissioner Green moved that the petition appearing on the foregoing paper, signed by Charles C. Clifton et al., in Benefit District No. 1, which, in the opinion of the board, is a public utility, be granted. Commissioner Andrews seconded the motion, and upon a vote being taken, Commissioner Andrews and Green ~~in~~ voted aye, and no vote being recorded against the motion, Chairman Harker declared the motion carried.
