

Saturday, Oct. 13 - 1917.

The board met in regular session, all the members in attendance, the Commissioners and Chairman J. L. Horner presiding.

The board authorized the issuance of the following order of debt directed to J. C. Ottumson, County Treasurer:

"By order of the Board of County Commissioners, which order was made at the regular session held Saturday, Oct. 13, 1917, you are hereby directed to cancel ~~for~~ July 1917, penalties accruing against the property described as follows: Parcel of which property appears on the tax rolls in the name of Willis K. Felt."

"Begin 125 feet west of the northeast corner of lot 1, Block 3, Lone Place, thence west 125 feet, north 24 feet, east 125 feet, south 24 feet."

And the following order:

"By order of the Board of County Commissioners, which order was made at the regular session held Saturday, Oct. 13, 1917, you are hereby directed to cancel taxes to the amount of \$12.95, levied for the year 1917 on improvements which were not in existence on Oct. 1, 1917, in Parkdale addition to the city of Lawrence, and which lot appears on the tax rolls in the name of F. L. Martin."

Friday, October 19 - 1917.

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session to canvass the votes cast at the special election held in Lawrence, Kansas on Wednesday, October 17, 1917, for the purpose of voting on the proposition for the formation of a rural high school and to issue bonds in the amount of \$25,000.00 to construct a rural high school building at Lawrence, in Douglas County, Kansas. The canvass of the returns from said special election showed the following:

Total number of votes cast within the corporate limits of the city of Lawrence, 158, of which number 156 votes were recorded.
