The Board met in regular session, with all members present and Commissioner J. L. Hoover presiding.

Monday, January 7, 1918

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the first day of the January session, all members being present and Commissioner J. L. Hoover presiding.

On the application of John D. McCray, 7 years of age, by his physician, Dr. E. J. Blair, for admission to the Bell Memorial Hospital at Bristol, Tenn., permission was granted by the Board for his stay in said hospital for a period of two weeks, the County assuming the expenses for that period of time.

On motion of Commissioner Green, seconded by Commissioner Andrews, it was voted to appropriate \$300.00 for a bridge known as the Mackley Bridge, the same to be charged to the general fund of the County.

Claims against the County were presented, audited and allowed as per Allowance Record.

The petition of John Dyer & 12 others was presented to the Board, praying for the location of a certain road, described as follows, viz: "Beginning at a stake in Road 9486 at the line between Sec. 14 & 15, T. 13 S. of R. 18 E. of the 6th P.M. at the back side of the old existing road S.E. 1/4, along the line of the 1/4 sec. line of the 1/4 sec. of said sec. 14, thence to terminate at said road No. 9486 at the corner of said line that the following would be located, all of Road 9486 between the beginning and end of said road to be located as above described." Whereupon, said Board of County Commissioners appointed the following named persons, viz: J. L. Hoover, M. P. Allen & Allison Andrews, as viewers, with instruction to meet in conjunction with the County surveyor, at the beginning of said road in Clark township, on Thursday, the 31st day of January, 1918, and proceed to view said road and to give to all parties a hearing.

Tuesday, January 8, 1918-

The Board met in adjourned regular session, all members present, all Commissioners and Chairman J. L. Hoover presiding.

Claims against the County were presented, audited and allowed, for which see Allowance Record.

The Board examined and approved both the annual reports of the Inspectors of LeCompton township, also the reports of the Inspectors of Kanawha township.
