

Wednesday, April 3-1918

The board met in adjourned regular session, all members present, 4 Commissioners & Chairman W. R. Green presiding.

Claims against the County were presented, audited, allowed, for which the Commissioners' Allowance Board.

The Commissioners designated the following schedule of dates for the various taxing districts in Douglas county on which they would hear complaints, while sitting as a Board of Equalization:

May 20 - Kanawaka township & Grant township.
 May 21 - Leighton township, Leighton city, Clinton township.
 May 22 - Union township & Millers Springs township.
 May 23 - Palmyra township & Baldwin city.
 May 24 - Andover township & Andover city.
 May 25 - Wakarusa township.
 May 27, 28, 29, 31 - City of Lawrence.

Thursday, April 4-1918

The board early in the morning went to Topeka and returning in the afternoon assembled in adjourned regular session, all members in attendance, 4 Commissioners & Chairman W. R. Green presiding.

The following preamble & resolution was offered by Commissioner Brown, & by unanimous vote adopted. A copy of the same, in the form of a letter, addressed to the State Highway Commission, was signed by Chairman W. R. Green & to wit:

"We, the members of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, intend to improve the Douglas county section of the Fort to Fort Road as proposed for in the Fort to Fort Road Benefit district petition, and we hereby request that the State Highway Commission complete the plans, specifications and estimates for the road improvement early for the approval of the United States Secretary of Agriculture.

"We hereby agree to pay the State Highway Commission the actual expenses incurred in the preparation of these plans, specifications and estimates, payment for the work to be charged to the various
