

Thursday - June 13 - 1918.

The board resumed its session as a Board of Equalization, with all members present & Chairman M. R. Green presiding.

There were no complaints on this date & the board adjourned & met on the morrow, June 14 - 1918, at 10 o'clock A.M.

Friday, June 14 - 1918

The board reconvened at 10 o'clock this morning as a Board of Equalization, all members were present & Chairman Green presided.

Several complaints of unjust taxation were heard & adjusted by the board, for the equalizing of which see Assessment rolls of the various taxing districts.

Shortly before 5 o'clock the matter of increasing the rate of all farm lands in Douglas County 8%, as requested by the State Tax Commission, was taken up & discussed pro & con for three hours. The County Assessor, in presenting the matter to the board, stated that the recommendation of the Tax Commission he concurred in by the board. He compromised a present 3% blanket raise of 3% on all farm lands in Douglas County, over the assessment figures as finally determined by the State Tax Commission in 1916, finally was agreed upon, a motion to this effect being offered by Commissioner Hoover & seconded by Commissioner Andrews, & upon a vote being <sup>taken</sup> by all the Commissioners, including the chairman, voted for the adoption of this motion. Not any vote having been cast as opposing the motion, Chairman Green declared the motion unanimously carried.
