Continued.

It is further resolved, That the Board shall cause the expense of improving said road to be met from time to time by warrants drawn upon the special fund to be created therefor, and that the cost shall be estimated after the completion of said improvements and apportioned as follows:

(A) If any portion of the cost of said improvements is provided for by the receipt of Federal Aid or donations from other sources, the same shall be applied to the cost of improvements to the extent for which the same are given.

(B) That the remainder of the cost shall be apportioned fifty percent (50%) to this county, twenty-five percent (25%) to the taxable property within the township or townships in which the benefit district is situated, divided according to the area of the benefit district in each township; and twenty-five percent (25%) among the several tracts of land within the benefit district, designated on the map, according to the benefits accruing to the real property and improvements thereon within the limits shown on said map; and that, after the completion of the improvements and the application of Federal Aid and other donations and the ascertainment of the apportionment of cost to be charged against the county, and the taxable property of the township or townships and the amount assessed against the tracts of land within the benefit district, bonds be issued by the county commissioners as required by section 9 of chapter 265, and that said bonds or the proceeds thereof shall be used in paying the remaining outstanding warrants for said improvements.

In addition to the above the Board of County Commissioners shall cause to be constructed all necessary bridges upon said road and roads the cost of which shall exceed \$2,000 or that shall have a span of 25 feet or more. All such bridges shall be paid for by the county out of the county bridge fund and with the assistance of such Federal Aid as may be granted for said bridges.
