

Saturday, Nov. 16 - 1918

The board met in regular session. All members were present, and Commissioner and Chairman W. R. Green presided.

A contract was entered into between this (Douglas) County and the Chamberlin Metal Weather Strip Company wherein the latter concerns agrees to furnish and install in the Douglas County Court house Chamberlin Metal Weather Strip in seven double hung windows, two of which are in the room of the Clerk of the Court, and five in the County Superintendent's room, at a cost of \$100.00 and guarantee to correct any defects due to imperfect material or workmanship for a period of ten years from this date.

The commissioners of the City of Lawrence, met with the board in an effort to reach an agreement with reference to the amount of damages to be allowed H. G. Osborn and E. F. Caldwell to real estate and improvements thereon because of the fill made by this county as an approach to the bridge across the Kansas river at Lawrence, the amount agreed upon and accepted by the two parties mentioned above, H. G. Osborn and E. F. Caldwell was \$400.00. The affidavit of ownership and release signed by H. G. Osborn and E. F. Caldwell is set out in full, as follows:

Affidavit of ownership and release.

State of Kansas

H. G. Osborn and E. F. Caldwell of lawful age, being each first duly sworn, on oath say that they are at this 12th day of June, 1918 the lawful owners in fee simple of the following described real estate to wit:

The South fifteen (15) feet of Lot Number forty-nine (49) and the North seven (7) feet of Lot Number forty seven (47) on Bridge Street in that part of the City of Lawrence, known as North Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas.

And have full right to make settlement with relation to or on account of any damage to said real estate.
