

Saturday, December 28-1918

The board met in regular session, all members present, and Commissioner W. R. Green presiding.

The board ordered a cancellation of \$500 value for improvements on lots 3 & 5, Marshall's Addition to the city of Baldwin, assessed against Helen L. Choller & H. H. Van Kuren, the tax against each lot being \$12.46, a total of \$24.92.

A like cancellation was ordered on \$5,000 valuation for improvements on the J. E. Stubbs property, consisting of 2 $\frac{78}{100}$ acres in Sec. 37-17-20 (Wakarusa Township) Sch. Dist. #81, the tax amounting to \$46.05.

A similar cancellation was ordered on \$1,010 valuation for improvements on the property, assessed against Myrtle Bullock, widow of the estate of Archibald B. Bullock, City of Lawrence, amounting to \$20.90, the board being satisfied that the money was invested in Liberty bonds of the U.S. government.

In each of the above cancellation orders the clerk was instructed to ~~draw~~ ^{sign} a cancellation order on the County Treasurer for the different amounts.

Monday, January 6-1919.

The board met in regular session for the first day of the January session. All the members were present, and Commissioner W. R. Green presided.

The application of Arthur L. Carson, through his physician, Dr. John C. Philbrick, for admission to Bell Memorial Hospital, Buffalo, N.Y. for a period of 30 days was granted.

The board authorized a cancellation of tax amounting to \$72.11 assessed against Mrs. A. B. Tilge in Baldwin City, on a personal property valuation of \$2895, and directed that the same valuation be assessed against her in Wilson Springs Township, School District No. 74, for Town, the tax amounting to \$30.48.
