

However, that if the Legislature fails to amend the law in this particular, the monthly appropriation of \$100⁰⁰ per month covers Commission Hoover seconded the motion, and upon a vote being taken, all the commissioners voted aye, not any having voted nay, the Chairman then declared the motion carried.

Saturday, January 25-1919-

The Board met in regular session, all members present, the Commissioner & Chairman M. R. Green presiding.

The bond of E. L. Brown, appointed Clerk in Wakarusa Township, Douglas County, was read & approved.

The Board directed that a cancellation order be issued in favor of Clarence W. Graed, cancelling previous property valuation of \$15,500, the tax on which amounts to \$320.85, it being shown to the satisfaction of the Board that the amount was invested in acquisition of worthless value.

The Board instructed the clerk to advertise in the official county paper for bids for repairs on the Leamington bridge, designating that bids must be received at the office of the C. Clerk until 12 o'clock noon of Friday, Feb. 21-1919, that each bid is to be accompanied by a certified check for \$5,000 to that place & specifications are on file in the Co. Clerk's office at Lawrence & Oskaloosa, the Board reserving the right to reject any or all bids.
