The following petition for Rural High School and bond election was received:

To the Honorable, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas:

We, the undersigned, legal electors residing in a territory containing not less than sixteen (16) square miles, and comprising Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, in Township 15, Range 18; Sections 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36, in Township 14, Range 18, all in Marion township; and Section 30 and 31, in Township 14, Range 19; and Sections 6, 7 and 18, in Township 15, Range 19, in Willow Springs township, in Douglas County, Kansas, being desirous of establishing a Rural High School district in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 311 of the Session Laws of Kansas of 1915, as amended by House Bill No. 586 of the Session Laws of 1917, do hereby petition your honorable body to call a special election for the purpose of voting on the proposition of establishing and locating a rural high school, and to vote bonds for the construction of a high school building.

The boundaries of said proposed rural high school district, in which we, the petitioners, reside, are as follows: Beginning at the southeast corner of Section 18, T. 15, R. 18, thence north 6 miles,
