

Friday - May 16 - 1919.

The Board met in regular session, with Commissioners Green and Andrews present. Commissioner & Chairman W. R. Green presided.

After a short session the board, in company with County attorney J. B. Wilson, drove out to Maleson and Grant townships, on an appraisal of land which it was desired as additional right of way for the proposed road surface Fort to Fort Highway, returning late in the evening, resuming their interrupted session, & making the following order:

Monday, May 19 - 1919.

The board met in regular session as a board of equalization to hear complaints, & if necessary to adjust matters, from Kanwaka & Grant townships. All members of the board were present, & Commissioner & Chairman W. R. Green presided.

No complaint was entered from either taxing district, consequently no adjustment necessary.

The resignation of W. F. Hartman as treasurer of Marion township was received & accepted. Upon recommendation of the township Republican committee, Arthur A. ^{an authorized Marion township} ~~was named~~ ^{to fill} the unexpired term of Mr. Hartman.
