The board resumed their labors this day as an equalizing board to hear complaints from residents of the city of Lawrence. All members of the board were present, & Commissioner & Chairman H. P. Allen presided.

Upon proper showing & recommendation by the County assessor, the valuation of personal property of the Boston Confectionery was reduced \$1,000 - from \$2,500 to \$1,500.

On the same showing & recommendation the valuation of personal property of Mary Conover was reduced \$50 - from \$275 to \$225.

The board again met as a board of equalization, this date, to hear complaints from residents of the city of Lawrence. All the commissioners were present & Commissioner & Chairman W. P. Allen presided.

It being shown to the satisfaction of the board, & having the recommendation of the County assessor, that improvements totalling \$700 had been removed from lot 15 Connecticut street, belonging to J. J. Tobler, it was ordered that this amount be cancelled from the valuation of that property.

For the same reason & recommendation by the Co. Assessor, \$250 was struck from the total valuation of \$1750 on lot 110.

\$350 was ordered struck from the total amount of personal property charged against E. S. Whately, it being shown to the satisfaction of the board that the amount stated had been invested in Liberty bonds since last October.
