aid work shall be subject to the approval of the County Highway Engineer of Douglas County, Kansas, who shall, on or about the last day of each month, make an estimate of the amount and value of the work done during the month. From the amount so found he shall deduct 15% of all sums previously paid on this work, and certify the remainder as then due.

On consideration of the true and faithful performance of all the conditions of this contract, the Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, agree to pay the undersigned the sum of One hundred eighty (\$180.00) dollars per linear mile of Survey Made.
