The board approved levies made by township boards, as follows:

Appraisers Wakarusa Twp., Gen. .50, road .25 - total .75 of mill; Grant, Gen. .20, road .80 - total 1.00 mill;
Township Leavenworth Twp., .75, road 2.50 - total \$3.25 mills; Kanawaka, Gen. .25, road 2.00 - total 2.25 mills;
Levies. Clinton Twp., Gen. .50, road 1.50 - total 2.00 mills; Marion, Gen. .50, road 1.75 - total 2.25 mills;
Yellow Springs Twp., Gen. .50, road 1.50 - total 2.00 mills; Aurora Twp., Gen. .50, road 1.50 - total 2.00 mills;
Palmers Twp., Gen. .25, road 1.25 - total 1.50 mills. Approval given above levies was obtained

through motion of Commissioner Orr, who moved that the levies indicated above for the various townships be approved. Commissioner Hoover seconded the motion, the vote being taken Commissioner Cox, Hoover & Anderson voted aye, but not one vote being cast negative, Commissioner & Chairman Anderson declared the motion adopted as the levies approved.
