Resolution Engineer of Douglas County in all matters connected with the survey of the Old Santa Fe Trail road and the preparation of profile, map, plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of that road according to petition heretofore presented by the Board, and that the appointment shall expire upon the completion of said survey and the approval of said plans, specifications, etc., by the State Highway Commission, and the further completion of the duties of the said B. L. Wolfe as provided by contract entered into between said B. L. Wolfe and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County pertaining to the above matters."

Resolution Commissioner Hoover moved its adoption, which motion being seconded by Commissioner Cox, a vote on the adoption of the resolution was ordered; as all Commissioners voting are not one vote being cast against the motion, Chairman Andrews declared the motion carried & the resolution adopted.

Claims Claims against the County were presented, audited and allowed, for which see August Allowance Record.

Saturday, August 16-1919.

The Board met in regular session, all Commissioners present, and Chairman A. Andrews presiding.

Fixed Date Upon request, and by motion made by Commissioner Cox and seconded by Commissioner Hoover, which motion was unanimously adopted, the Board rescinded its former action designating August 26-1919, as the date for holding the special bond election in school district No. 17, (Beechview) and left the date open upon which the election is to be held.

Open Bids This being the date on which bids were to be opened for the construction of Sections E and F, Fort & Fort Highway, Federal Aid Project No. 7, Federal Road District No. 5, at the hour of 11 o'clock a.m., the clerk brought in and read the one bid received, that from Cook & O'Brien Co. of K.C., Mo. This bid on Sec. E was \$25,268.²⁵ and on Section F \$57,805.⁰¹. After consideration, upon motion of Commissioner Cox, seconded by Commissioner Hoover, and unanimously passed, the Board rejected the bid of Cook & O'Brien Co. on Sections E and F.
