After determining the late Commissioner Cox moved that the levies for the County, as indicated above, be approved. Commissioner Horner seconded the motion, and a vote being taken on the adoption of the motion, Commissioners Cox, Horner and Andrews voted aye, and not one vote being cast against the adoption of the motion, approving the levies, Chairman Andrews declared the motion carried and the levies approved.

Commissioner Horner moved that the levies for certain school districts be made, the purpose of the levy being to provide funds to meet interest and to take up bonds falling due, the school districts and the tax levies to be made for each district to be as follows, to-wit:

Commissioner Cox seconded the motion, a vote being taken on the adoption of the motion, and not one vote having been cast in the negative, Chairman Andrews declared the motion carried and the tax levies as above indicated authorized to be made.

The Commissioners determined that on Wednesday, September 3, 1919, they would meet with the County Commissioners of Leavenworth County, in Leavenworth, to discuss in joint session the Enders bridge repair matter. The Commissioners were to be accompanied by the County Attorney, Mr. J. B. Milnor, Allison Andrews, Chairman.
