

Saturday, Sept. 6, 1919.

The board met in adjourned regular session, all Commissioners present, and Commissioner & Chairman A. Andrew presiding.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hoover, which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, the board authorized the cancellation of County warrants, drawn previous to June 30, 1916, in favor of various persons & firms, not called for and remaining in the hands of the County Clerk, aggregating in amount \$87.20.

The board approved the bond of C. M. Fisher, appointed Constable for Lawrence City, in the amount of \$2,000, with Will John as Sec. B. Sheets as sureties.

The board, upon motion of Commissioner Cox which was seconded by Commissioner Hoover, voted to increase the salary of the County House Janitor from \$70.00 a month to \$90.00 a month, with the understanding that the janitor devote all his time to his duties as such, that he is to keep clean the floor from dirt and cobwebs and dust and paper litter the various office rooms, the lobbies and the entrance to the different office rooms.

The board, upon motion of Commissioner Hoover, which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, voted to increase the salary of the Superintendent of the County Home from \$50.00 a month to \$75.00 a month, the increase in salary to start with October 1, 1919. A requirement of the motion is that hereafter the Superintendent ~~to~~ submit an affidavit this monthly and annual reports.

The board granted the application of Asher Parson, made in proper form, for admission to the Pullman Memorial Hospital, ~~and~~ to obtain treatment for chronic nephritis. No limit was placed on his period of stay.
