

Saturday, September 20 - 1919.

The board met in regular session, all Commissioners present, the Commissioner the Chairman A. Andrews presiding. Commissioner Love moved, and Commissioner Houser seconded the motion, that the judge of certain duties of School District No. 17 (Baldwin), asking for permission to hold a special election of the patrons of that district for the purpose of voting on a proposition to issue bonds for the creation of a school building, be granted, and designating Friday, October 10 - 1919, as the day and date on which such special election shall be held, was adopted, all commissioners voting affirmatively in support of the resolution, and not one vote being cast in the negative. Chairman Andrews declared the motion adopted.

By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board directed the clerk to issue a compromise order directed to the County Treasurer authorizing him to accept as full payment the sum of \$46.00 in payment of delinquent tax for the year 1900 on lot 158 Lawrence street, Lawrence, at that time the property of Mr. J. D. Brown.

By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board authorized the Chairman to sign a contract between the Bd. of C. Commissioners of Douglas County, party of the first part, and the Princeton Oil Company, party of the second part, wherein the Princeton Oil Co. is given the right to the use of certain highways for the purpose of constructing a pipeline.
