

of the following resolution, to-wit:

Resolved, That the County Engineers of Leavenworth and Douglas Counties be hereby requested to make plans, specifications and estimates for all necessary repairs to the north end of the bridge across the river at Euclid, Kansas, and submit the same to the Public Utilities Commission of Kansas for their approval, and further, to revise, if in their judgment it should be done, the estimates on the dyke work at said point, heretofore advertised; that when the plans, specifications, and estimates just referred to have been approved by the Public Utilities Commission of Kansas, copies of the same be filed with the clerk of said Counties, and that upon the filing of such copies the County Clerk of Leavenworth and Douglas Counties are hereby ordered to advertise for bids on the entire work as above indicated in the manner provided by law, said bids to be opened at a meeting of the joint boards of Douglas and Leavenworth Counties to be held in Lawrence, Kansas, at a time to be hereafter agreed upon by the boards of County Commissioners of said Counties.

A vote on the adoption of the above resolution being ordered & taken, all the Commissioners comprising the joint board voted aye, no vote being cast in the negative, Chairman Short declared the motion adopted. Upon motion made, seconded & passed the joint board adjourned sine die.
