

Nov. 19-20-21-25-1918-

The board was in attendance upon Court on each of these days, & for their attention to the conduct of certain horse road cases, in which the County was defendant in damage claimed; but in damage claimed by C. M. Albright for 38 head of cattle condemned as tubercular & killed.

Saturday, November 29, 1918-

The board met in regular session, all Commissioners present, but Commissioner & Chairman A. Andrews presiding.

This was the date set apart for consideration of insurance on the three County properties - Court House, Jail & Sheriff's residence & County Home.

By motion made, seconded & passed the board directed cancellation of all existing insurance policies, of whatever nature, covering the three County properties, as of date December 1, 1918, & a rewriting of policies, amounting in the aggregate to \$142,250, divided among the various local insurance agencies as follows:
