ing determined by the introduction of the following motion.

By Commissioner Cox: With reference to the recent
of the State Tax Commission, communicated to the County
Clerk under date of December 18, 1919, and by him trans-
mitted to the board December 20, 1919, conveying the sug-
gestion that a reassessment of Real Value for Douglas
County is desirable, be not entertained, having our
refusal on the ground that present values are abnormal,
entirely out of proportion to the true values, are not
stable, and in our judgment our belief will show a de-
cline to more reasonable and actual value figures
within a short period of time; we further, directing the
clerk to communicate this action of the board to the
State Tax Commission at an early date.

The above motion was seconded by Commissioner
Hovver, and a vote being taken on its adoption Commis-
sioners Cox, Hovver, & the Chairman, A. Andrews, voted af-
firmatively, and not one vote being cast negative, the Chair-
man declared the motion carried.

The monthly report of the Poor Commissioner and the
superintendent of the County Home were approved.

The board met in regular session, all com-
missioners present, the Commissioners & Chairman A.
Andrews presiding.

The board received a check for \$55.00 from the
K. C., K. V. & W. R. R. (Interurban) in payment of movement

The board took up the matter of insurance upon the three
county building, and upon motion made, seconded & passed de-
clined to reconsider the action taken November 29, 1919, the action
