The board met in ^{adjourned} regular session, all commissioners present, Mr. Commission & Chairman G. Andrews presiding.

For the following: ^{Contract} down spouting on the new county garage. Guttering two bids were received: One from W. E. Penhale for guttering, down spouting & connection with sewer, at \$92.68; an one from F. W. George Broker, for guttering and down spouting, but not connection with sewer, at \$73.00. By motion made, seconded & passed the contract for the work, which includes guttering, down spouting & connection with sewer, was awarded to W. E. Penhale, at \$73.00.

A compromise agreement was entered into between the Shirley Deed board & a Mr. Shirk, recent purchaser of lot 179 in 181 High Street, Baldwin, for release tax, interest & fee, by payment by Tax. Mr. Shirk of tax, the county remitting interest cost & fees.

Set Date: The board received the notice of appeal of J. C. Houser, a citizen of School district No. 31, ^{to} from the decision of R. Houser the County appraiser, who refused to change his tax from A. S. Appeal. district No. 31 to district no. 25. The board designated Saturday, Jan 17-1920, as a date for hearing the appeal.

Clerk Tax: By motion made, seconded & passed, ^{to} upon recommendation by the County attorney ⁱⁿ conformity with alleged instructions from the State Tax Commission, the board ordered a Tax Against cancellation of tax appearing on the 1919 tax rolls on the South property, 45x-50 ft. of lot 2 as the road 25 ft. of lot 3, both block 8, Rural territory: Knights, an addition to the city of Lawrence, the assessed valuation of which is \$5,700 the tax \$140.58. the property having passed into the control of the Kansas property.
