

Wednesday - January 14, 1920.

The board met in adjourned regular session, all Commissioners present and Commissioner W. C. Chase as man A. Andrews presiding.

Co. Physi. Upon motion by Commissioner Cox, seconded by Commissioner Hoover, & passed, Dr. J. B. Tracy was named as Health County Physician & County Health Officer at a monthly salary of \$75.00 & mileage at the rate of 10¢ a mile. This compensation is to include one inspection of every school in the County each year.

The subject of County printing was then taken up. The clerk read a bid from the Lawrence Democrat offering to do the printing at the rate of 20¢ an inch, six 10-point lines being considered an inch. An offer for the printing also was received from the Daily Journal-World, offering to do the work at legal rates, and citing the larger & County-wide circulation as inducement.

A ballot on selecting a paper for the official County printing was ordered & taken, resulting in two votes for the Journal-World & one vote for the Democrat. The result being announced by the clerk Chairman Andrews declared the Journal-World the official County paper for 1920.

Appoint. Upon suggestion from residents of the district, the board Judges & appointed the following persons to serve as judges & Clerks at the special school election to be held in Leomington on Saturday January 31, 1920: Judges - C. B. Winter, O. E. Baugh. School Exec. Mar. P. M. Gray; Clerks - Ruth Glenn, Ella Galtrey.

The board in the afternoon drove to Mount Township & made an official inspection of the work done on Section A & B. Fort to Fort road.

Reports The annual reports of the trustees of Endora & Calmoga townships were received, checked & approved by the board.
