Horkinson & 18 others, asking for the vacation of a certain road described as follows: Beginning at the corner of Sec. 7, 12, 13, 18, Twp. 14, Range 20 & 21, extending south 1 mile to the corner of section 18, 13, 24 & 14, Twp. 14, Range 20 & 21, in Douglas county, Kansas, and locate and establish a road as follows: Beginning on Section line 20 ft. east of quarter section corner stone between Sec. 12 & 13, Twp. 14, Range 20, thence south one mile to a point 20 feet east of quarter section corner stone between Sec. 13 & 24, Twp. 14, Range 20, in said county & state, was received, read & upon motion made, seconded and passed, & Friday, March 26-1920, was named as a date upon which said proposed vacation & location was to be viewed, & Allison Andrews, A. L. Cox & J. L. Hoover, in conjunction with the County Surveyor, named as viewers.
