

Monday, March 1 - 1920.

The board met for the first day of the March session. All the Commissioners were present, and Commissioner & Chairman A. Andrews presided.

The board received the petition of James F. Stahl & 15 others, praying for the vacation of a road described as follows:

"Beginning at the center of Section 18, Twp. 13-Range 18, and running South one mile and about 20 rods, and terminating at the intersection of this road and the road running East and West just south of the middle of Sec. 19, Twp. 13, Range 18."

Upon motion made, seconded and passed the board designated Wednesday, March 25-1920, as the date upon which to view said proposed vacated road, and appointed John L. Horner, A. L. Cox and Allison Andrews as viewers.
