The board met in adjourned regular session, all the Commissioners present, but Commissioner Chairman A. Andrews presiding.

The board, having under consideration the issuance of bonds to aid in the construction of the Fort to Fort road, Project No. 7, Benefit District No. 1, went over the matter at length. Commissioner Cox offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Be it Resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 6th day of March, 1920, that pursuant to authority granted under Chapter 765, Session Laws of 1917 as amended by Chapter 246, Session Laws of 1919, State of Kansas, it is hereby ordered that for the purpose of paying the expense of the permanent improvement of the road known as the Fort to Fort Highway, Project No. 7, in Benefit District No. one, Douglas County, Kansas, as per contracts heretofore entered into by the said county and approved by the Highway Commission of the State of Kansas, there be issued by said county its bonds in the total amount of fifty thousand dollars, the same to be dated July 1, 1920, to draw interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, principal and interest payable at the office of the State Treasurer of Kansas, at Topeka, Kansas, twenty thousand dollars of said bonds to be in denominations of \$500.00 each, and thirty thousand dollars of said bonds to be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, one-tenth in amount of said bonds to become due on the 1st day of July of each year after the date thereof.

That the full faith, credit and resources of Douglas County, Kansas, be, and the same is hereby pledged, for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon as per the terms thereof.

That the chairman of the board of County Commissioners of said county is hereby authorized to sign said bonds and interest coupons thereto attached, and the county clerk of said county is hereby authorized to attest the same by his signature and seal of said county. That the said coupons may be so signed and attested by the free simile signatures of said chairman and clerk.

Commissioner Hoover seconded the ~~motion~~ motion and upon a
