

miles north of the place of beginning, where the north-east corner of said section 11 and the north-west corner of section 12 touch the last named public road.

The board designated Thursday, June 17, 1920, as a date on which to view said proposed change in road and named Allison Andrews, John L. Hoover and A. L. Cox as viewers.

A road petition signed by J. E. Hardtger and 14 others, was presented to the board praying for the vacation of a certain road described as follows, viz:

Beginning at the southwest corner of section 1 and the southeast corner of section 2, both in township 15, range 17, Douglas county, Kans., and running thence north on the line between the aforesaid sections 1 and 2, and terminating at the public road one mile from the place of beginning.

The board designated Thursday, June 17, 1920, as a date on which to view said proposed change in road and named Allison Andrews, John L. Hoover and A. L. Cox as viewers.

Commissioner Cox read and moved the adoption of the following resolution on the proposed improvement of federal road through the City of Baldwin, as follows:

Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of said county, that the section of City road described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the City road designated by the State Highway Commission as a proposed federal aid road, said point being from center of south section line of section 3 township 15, range 20, which is the south-east corner of Baldwin City, and extending thence along said road through the City as follows: west on south line of city limits to Fifth Street, thence north on Sixth Street to High Street, thence west on High Street to the west city limits, a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, more or less, to the point of ending, as initiated by the preliminary resolution of this board passed August 13, 1919, be improved as a federal aid road, and that the construction and maintenance work be carried out under the direct supervision of the State Highway Commission, acting as agent for said county, as required in the Federal Aid
