

Thursday, June 10 - 1920.

The board met in adjourned regular session, all commissioners present, the Commissioner and Chairman A. Andrews presiding.

The board met, as per order heretofore made to consider the amount for taxation of the property of the Citizens' Light, Heat & Power Co (gas company). The board found that due and proper notice of said meeting of Taxes was served on the Citizens' Light, Heat & Power Co. as prescribed by law, and that the said Company is present C. L. H. by its attorney, And. Celingman.

P.C. Different methods of assessing the company's property were discussed at length. On motion made, seconded and passed, the board ordered the County Assessor of this county at once to assess all properties of the Citizens' Light, Heat & Power Co. within Douglas County, Kansas, not otherwise properly assessed, for taxation purposes as said statute as provided by law; and that this meeting be adjourned until June 28 - 1920, at 10 o'clock A.M., for further consideration of this matter.

Objection Entered by Gas Co. atty. Attorney Celingman, as the representative of the Citizens' Light, Heat & Power Co. objects and excepts to the above as being an improper method of assessing.

This was the first of the three days' final session of the board as an equalizing board. No applications for adjustments were received.
