The Board met in Regular Session, all the Commissioners present, and Commissioner and Chairman G. H. Hutton presiding.

The Board took up the resolution as prepared by Attorney

Road Im. Bonds & Figgell, representing the Fidelity National Bank

Trust Co., and upon approval by the County Attorney, after

authorizing the substitution of the per cent (in relation to the

estimated cost of the improvements covered by the various sec-

tions to be apportioned to the County, the townships and the several

tracts of land within Benefit District No. 1 and 2) and changing

the word fifteen to "ten" (as applying to the number of annual as-

essments to be levied upon lands in Benefit District No. 2),

upon motion made, seconded and passed, adopted the resolution

and ordered its inclusion in the minutes of the Board meeting of

this date, as follows, to-wit:

Whereas, there was duly filed with the Board of County

Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, on September 18, 1917,

a petition for the permanent improvement of a certain public

road in Douglas County, Kansas, known as the Fort to Fort

Highway, the terminal points and other specially fixed locations

of said road being particularly described in said petition, which

petition also designated the lands within the proposed benefit

district, known as Benefit District No. 1, the type of permanent

improvement and width of roadway desired, and the number of an-

ual assessments to be levied upon the lands in the benefit district

in payment of said improvement, the number of said annual assess-

ments being ten; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas,

did at a regular meeting of said board held on March 16, 1918, find

that the improvement proposed for was one of public utility; that said

petition was signed by individuals constituting more than 51% of

the resident land owners owning more than 35% of the land

within the district defined by said petition; that said petition properly

designated the road to be improved both by name and by terminal

points and by other specially fixed locations, and that the petition definitely

designated the lands within the proposed benefit district, the type of

permanent improvement and the width of roadway and the number of

annual assessments to be levied upon the lands in said district in

payment of said improvement, said number of annual assessments being ten,

and that said petition was in all respects in compliance with the pro-

visions of the Statute of the State of Kansas; and
