

\$300,000 of said bonds and the interest thereon. For the purpose of paying the
 Bond interest on said bonds, and for the purpose of paying the principal
 Resolution thing as said principal becomes due, the Board of County Com-
 missioners of said County shall annually levy upon all the tax-
 able property of said County and of the townships in the proper propor-
 tion a tax sufficient to produce a fund to pay the interest on said
 bonds and to pay the principal of said bonds as said bonds be-
 come due.
