Likewise, in confirming a former action of the board held August 6-1920, at a time when only two members of the board were present, Chairman Andrews being sick and unable to attend, the board this date, upon motion made by Commissioner Hoover, seconded by Commissioner Cox, and adopted - Commissioners Andrews, Cox and Hoover voting affirmative and not one vote cast negative - approved the following township levies - (the relation in the different townships having been increased to conform with the 2% increase on farm land authorized by the State Tax Commission) - for the various townships, as indicated below, ~~for general purposes~~, viz:
