Upon proper application Robert Harbour of Endora was admitted to the asylum for epileptics at Parsons, Kans.

Upon recommendation of the County assessor the board directed a refund on a valuation of \$75.00 appearing on the tax roll against Arthur Tuttle.

Upon a proper application the board directed a cancellation of tax for the year 1858 against lot 79 Mass. St., in favor of L. H. Menger owner.

The board rejected the bill of E. A. Kasold of \$15.00, for additional compensation for rent of room for the general election held Nov. 2, 1920.

Claims against the County were presented, audited and allowed, for which see Jan. Allowance Record.

The board met in adjourned regular session. Commissioners Andrews & Hoover in attendance, Commissioner Cox absent on account of sickness, Commissioner & Chairman A. Andrews presided.

The depository bonds of the Watkins National Bank and the Lawrence National Bank, the first named for \$30,000.00 and the second for \$15,000.00 were approved.

The monthly reports of Co. Farm Supt. Sizer and the quarterly reports of the Register of Deeds, Sheriff and Clerk of District Court were audited and approved.

Upon proper application the board ordered a refund to Rose M. Raybourn on a valuation of \$50.00, account erroneous assessment of personal property.
