

Upon motion made seconded and passed, the board unanimously adopted the following resolution:

Resolved, by The Board of County Commissioners in regular session assembled this 15th day of January, 1921, that for the purpose of expediting and systemizing the work of this board the first three days of each monthly session be devoted exclusively to the consideration and allowance of claims against the County; that all claims filed with the county clerk after the expiration of the three-day period mentioned above be held over until the next regular session of the board in the month following.

This order to be effective from and after March 1, 1921.

The board having under consideration the application ~~of the~~ of the Acacia Educational & Building Association, and placing of a part of the property owned by this association on the exempt list, upon motion made, seconded and passed, made the following order:

And now on this 15th day of January, 1921, comes on for hearing the application for cancellation of taxes of the Acacia Educational & Building Association, on the real property there in described, heretofore filed in the office of the County Clerk, the said Association appearing by Walter G. Thiele, its secretary and attorney; and this board, having heard the said application, and the evidence in support thereof, and the arguments of counsel thereon, finds:

First: That the real estate, the taxation of which is in question herein, is the following:

Beginning at the South East Corner of Section 36, Township 12, Range 18. Thence West 20 rods; Thence north 22.4 rods; Thence East 20 rods; thence South 22.4 rods to the point of beginning, all in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas; and that said real estate was assessed for taxation for the year 1920 and the tax due thereon for said year found to be \$75.13, as shown by the tax rolls of Douglas County, Kansas;

Second: That the above described real estate is owned by the Acacia Educational & Building Association, and corporation, which is the applicant herein; That said Association was chartered by the State of Kansas, in the manner provided by law, on June 27th, 1918, and that under its charter, it is a corporation organized not for profit, and the purposes for which it is formed are to promote the pursuit of literary, scientific and profes-
